


# COLORADO'S CUTTING-EDGE CHILD WELFARE TRAINING SYSTEM

- **Regionalized learning delivery and relationship management.** Regionalization makes learning opportunities available locally for Colorado's child welfare workforce and foster parent communities.
- **Authored more than 100 new course curricula.** New curricula are providing the child welfare community with the most current and relevant topics available to the child welfare community. In addition, training is delivered using the most innovative instructional methods.
- **Designed and launched multi-dimensional technology-based instructional platforms.** This innovative way of delivering way training makes learning opportunities accessible and efficient for anyone at any time, and it increases knowledge attainment.
- **Implemented applied skills simulations.** These practical real-to-life experiences are an important aspect of each academy for new caseworkers, new supervisors, and mid-level managers.
