BUILDING LOCAL CAPACITY TO IDENTIFY CHILD TRAUMA AND PROVIDE QUALITY MEDICAL AND BEHAVIORAL ASSESSMENTS FOR SUSPECTED VICTIMS OF CHILD ABUSE AND NEGLECT.

The Program

The Child Abuse Response and Evaluation (CARE) Network engages health care and behavioral health providers across Colorado with the best education and training on conducting medical exams and behavioral health assessments to identify signs and risks of child maltreatment or trauma. Providers also learn about the resources available to families to mitigate those risks and expand the safety net for children.

Why It's Needed:

Expertise to conduct medical exams and behavioral health assessments to evaluate suspected cases of child abuse and neglect is extremely limited. There are only seven board-certified specialists in the field of child abuse pediatrics in Colorado, which limits access to expert evaluations for children in most of the state's 64 counties.

Additionally, **children from all backgrounds can be at risk of experiencing trauma, especially when a family is experiencing multiple life stressors.** By educating and training health care and behavioral health providers on how to identify family stresses and challenges that may lead to maltreatment, we can reduce severe incidents of child abuse and neglect.

Our Vision

With the CARE Network, Kempe hopes to create a broad field of health care and behavioral health professionals, including pediatricians, family medicine doctors, nurses, school nurses and others, which will become an integral part of the safety net for children. The ultimate goal is to reach families and provide them with available resources to address trauma issues, reduce incidents of child maltreatment and negate a need for child welfare involvement.
